Rules, Regulations and Acceptance of Entries

The following rules, regulations & acceptance of entries apply to all sections/competitions where applicable.

- Entries are accepted subject to the General Rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies (QCAS) and to the Constitution and Rules of this Society in addition to any Special Regulations which appear within this schedule.
- Every care will be taken of exhibits, but the Society shall not be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits while at the Show or in transit to and from the grounds.
- All entries close on the dates shown in each respective section.
- No exhibit can be removed before 4:00pm on Wednesday 5th June 2023 (or after the Major Prize Draw) without permission of the Stewards in charge of the section.
- All exhibits must be the actual property of the exhibitor in whose name they are entered. The actual breeder of livestock exhibits to be given where possible.
- Exhibits entered in the wrong class may be transferred to the proper class by the judge.
- Persons in charge of exhibits or sideshows must obey the orders of the Management Committee or Stewards or they may be fined or ejected from the grounds.
- No person except Stewards, Officials, Judges and handlers (if required) shall be permitted to remain in yards, rings or pavilions during judging on any pretence whatsoever.



- Some Sections will be judged Tuesday morning of the Show. These pavilions will be kept closed until Judging is completed.
- The judge may, at their discretion, refuse to award a prize where an exhibit is deemed by them to be not of sufficient merit.
- The judge's decision will be final and conclusive.
- Professional A professional is defined as someone who has qualifications in that field or is registered for GST.
- All prizes not claimed within thirty (30) days of closing date of Show will be considered to have lapsed and the amount will become a donation to the Society.
- All horses and other livestock, where practical, shall be paraded as directed by the Ring Steward.
 Exhibitors who do not comply may be fined at the discretion of the Stewards and any prizes won by their exhibits may be retained by the Society. The decision of the Ring Stewards to be final.
- Methods of counting points in trophies: Champion Awards will be counted three points as well as First Awards, Second Awards or Reserve Champion to count two points and Third Award to count one point. In the event of a tie for any place, the points awarded for the place and the next lower place shall be divided equally.
- The Emerald Showgrounds is a Glass Free venue, and the Show is a Glass Free Event.

ENTRIES CLOSE: Friday 31st May 2024. All fees must be paid in full with Nomination Forms.

DELIVERY DATE & TIME: All Exhibits must be delivered to the Showgrounds by 2pm Monday 3rd June 2024. (All Bulls and Led Steers will be weighed on Monday between 2pm and 4pm).

JUDGING: Stud Cattle and Led Steer competitions will commence at 8.30am Tuesday 4th June 2024.

CONDITIONS:

Entries close Friday 31st May 2024. Entries will not be accepted without entry fees.

- -A Waiver, Release and Acknowledgement Form must be signed and accompany the entry form online or can be handed in upon arrival.
- -The age of all stud beef cattle shall be the actual age as at 1st April 2024. The actual date of birth of each animal must be entered on the online entry form.
- -Cattle may be mouthed at the chief steward's discretion.
- -All exhibitors in stud classes must deliver to the chief steward a herd book certificate of each exhibit before 8am on the first day of the show if requested.
- -All stock must be owned for 3 (three) months prior to the show by the exhibitor.
- -Group entries must compete in general classes.
- -Breeders group all animals competing must be owned by the exhibitor but not necessarily bred by the exhibitor.
- -All cattle entered in the Stud Cattle section must be led, have either a nose ring/nose grip. No beast will be allowed in the Judging Ring/Grand Parade without them. All bulls over 12 months of age must have a nose ring.
- -Provided number cards must be worn during judging.
 -For the championship prizes all first prize winners from each class and section are to compete. After selecting the champion, the judge will be required to select any animal for reserve, which will take the place of the

champion in the event of the latter being disqualified for any cause. The reserve shall be selected from the remaining first prize animals together with the second-prize winner of the class, which furnished the champion.

- All classes in the competition may be combined at the Steward's discretion should there be insufficient numbers.
- -Any exhibitor who fails to parade their cattle in the grand parade on Wednesday 5th June 2024, may forfeit all prize money and trophies won, at the discretion of the stewards.
- -Positive evidence of infertility will be adequate reason for disqualification.
- -All relevant NVD forms are to be available and NLIS obligations met.
- -No drug, hormone or tranquilizer shall be administered to any animal exhibit except under the direction of the associations veterinary surgeon who shall advise the stewards if in his/ her option such drug, hormone or tranquilizer is likely to have any effect upon the animal which would be material to its chances of being awarded a prize and in such a case the stewards may debar the animal from competing. A steward may at any time direct the association's veterinary surgeons to take a sample of saliva or urine for testing.
- -All entrants and participants in all classes (including the junior & senior judges & parading classes) enter at their own risk. It also is the entrant's responsibility for any injury or damage to competitor or beast.

Bedding & Stall Allocations

- -Sawdust bedding is provided by the Emerald Show Society.
- -Shed allocations will be issued.

Arrival & Departure

- -All Exhibits must be delivered to the Stewards by 2pm on Monday 3rd June 2024 and all Bulls and Led Steers will be weighed that day between 2pm 4pm.
- -Competitors intending to arrive more than one day prior to show and/or departing one day later must obtain permission from the Secretary via the Stud Cattle Stewards, as charges may apply.
- -Exhibitors arriving prior to Monday 3rd June 2024 and requiring the use of the Saleyard facilities to house their cattle must produce a statutory declaration showing the chemical status on the fodder being fed. Please present these declarations to the Chief Steward prior to entering the Sale yards (this is a requirement of the Emerald Peak-Downs Saleyards Board).
- -All stud cattle entered for competition may be removed from the grounds after 4pm on Wednesday 5th June 2024.
- -The Emerald Show Grounds is a glass free venue and the Emerald Show is a glass free event.

- All competitors to be a resident in Queensland for three months prior to competition.
- Paraders may lead a Steer, Junior Heifer or Junior Bull (under 21 months, one animal per entrant).
- Entrants in the Young Paraders Competitions enter at their own risk. It also is the entrant's responsibility for any injury or damage to competitor or beast.
- Age groups may be combined/split at the Steward's discretion depending on numbers.

- Competitors under 18 years of age must have the approval of a parent/guardian to compete.
- National winners are ineligible to compete.
- All competitors to be a resident in Queensland for three months prior to competition.
- Entrants in the young judges' competitions enter at their own risk.
- Age groups may be combined/split at the Steward's discretion depending on numbers.

- The Hormel slide must be used at all levels in the Young Judging Competitions.
- Competitors must be under 25 years of age on the 1st of May 2024.
- Competitors under 18 years of age must have the approval of a parent/guardian to compete.
- National winners are ineligible to compete.
- All competitors to be a resident in Queensland for three months prior to competition or attending college in Queensland.
- Entrants in the young judges competitions enter at their own risk.
- Age groups may be combined/split at the Steward's discretion depending

YOUNG PARADERS

QCAS Paraders Competition Rules apply.

- 1. Competitors must be over 15 and under 25 years of age on the 1st May in the year of the State Final (2024).
- 2. One competitor from each show (Alpha, Capella, Clermont, Comet, Springsure & Emerald) between the age of 15 and 25 years will compete in the Final.
- 3. Competitors can represent only one Show in the Sub-Chamber Final.
- 4. Competitors must be a resident of the Central Highlands Sub-Chamber area for three months prior to competition.
- 5. National winners are ineligible to compete.
- 6. The winner of the Final will go on to represent the Central Highlands at the Ekka in August.

YOUNG JUDGES – STUD BEEF & PRIME CATTLE

QCAS Young Judges Rules apply.

- 1. The Hormel slide must be used at all levels in the Young Judging Competitions.
- 2. Competitors must be over 15 and under 25 years of age on the 1st May in the year of the State Final (2024).
- 3. The highest scoring competitor between the age of 15 and 25 years from each of the 5 shows (Alpha, Capella, Clermont, Comet, Springsure and Emerald) will compete in the Final.
- 4. Competitors can represent only one Show Society in the Sub-Chamber Final.
- 5. Competitors must be a resident of the Central Highlands Sub-Chamber area for three months prior to competition including attending college).
- 6. The winner of the Final will go on to represent the Central Highlands at the Ekka in August.
